Rooted in fair and reasonable terms and conditions, the Agreement was developed collaboratively between ACEC-Ontario and the MEA, with legal review. It balances the needs of the municipality while allowing consultants to complete their work according to the standards of practice of the profession.

- Reflects due diligence and a standard of care





History of the Agreement

- 1989 "Client/Consultant Agreement for Municipal Works"
 - · ACEC-Ontario (formerly known as CEO) and MEA jointly develop the Agreement
 - In the form of a Memorandum of Agreement
 - Contained detailed General Conditions and information, Fees and Disbursements and Services information
- 2002 Introduction of a "Consultant Appraisal Form"
 - · Overall Success of the Project
 - Quality of Service Performed on the Project
 - Corporate Practices for a Successful Project
 - No longer in wide use has not been updated/maintained





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History of the Agreement

- 2006
 - Minor changes to the General Conditions and Fees
- 2016 "Client/Engineer Agreement for Professional Consulting Services"
 - · Reformatted into a contract form
 - The term "Engineer" replaced "Consultant"
- 2017 2018
 - Introduction of the fillable field PDF format
 - · Copyright disclaimer included
 - · Accompanying User Guide developed for ease of use





Recent Agreement Updates

- 2019 Construction Act compliance
 - The Agreement was updated to reflect and comply with the new *Construction Act* provisions which came into effect October 2019
 - Updated Dispute Resolution clause to reflect new provisions
- **2021** Next iteration...
 - The Agreement is currently under review by ACEC-Ontario and MEA
 - Modernization of General Terms and Conditions to reflect rapidly changing insurance, legal requirements and industry standards

- Indemnification
- Dispute Resolution
- Insurance
- Intellectual Property
- Force Majeure







Indemnification

- Indemnification a duty to make good on a loss, damage, or liability incurred by another under the terms of an agreement
- A means of risk transfer
- Agreement provides municipality with indemnification based on negligence on the part of the engineer
- Reciprocal indemnification provided







Dispute Resolution

- MEA/ACEC-Ontario Agreement provides for escalating methods of dispute resolution:
 - Negotiation
 - Mediation
 - Arbitration
- Intent is to avoid litigation of disputes
 - Costly
 - · Time consuming







Insurance

- Includes requirements for
 - · General liability
 - Automobile
 - Professional liability
- Coverages can't be changed or cancelled without written notice
- Limitation of liability







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Intellectual Property

- Generally, intellectual property remains the property of the engineer
- Municipality has permanent, nonexclusive, royalty-free license to use the engineer's intellectual property in connection with the project in question and for no other purpose or project







Force Majeure

- Engineer is not responsible for damages arising directly or indirectly from delays caused by things beyond their control, including labour disputes; severe weather or other natural disasters; riots, war or other emergencies, etc.
- Engineer is entitled to reasonable adjustment in schedule and compensation if such delays increase the cost or time to perform the services







MEA/ACEC-Ontario Standard Agreement User Guide

- Comprehensive User Guide to provide clarification and guidance to municipalities and engineers who are entering into a contractual agreement to complete professional consulting services
- Terms and Conditions are explained
- Rationale for including the various elements and articles in the contract
