



Transit Expansion Division – Role and Scope



Established in 2019...







Leading inter-governmental engagement

on transit expansion (negotiating agreements to support delivery of transit programs- master agreements, resourcing, etc).

Centralizing Program Management by providing end-to-end oversight of transit project lifecycle

Coordinating internal City partners to establish whole-of-government strategic City approach and inputs to transit expansion projects.

Coordinating decision-making on transit expansion program including governance, policy, issues management, reporting to City Council

More On TE's role

- 1. <u>SUPPORT PLANNING</u>: Contribute to the planning of transit infrastructure that aligns with Council approved policies/plans
- 2. <u>PARTNERS IN DELIVERY</u>: Work with partners to build & enhance a regional transit infrastructure network
- 3. <u>ACCOUNTABLE FOR MUNICIPAL COORDINATION</u>: Coordinating delivery of municipal requirements / components
- 4. <u>FACILITATE AND LEAD TORONTO'S TRANSIT EXPANSION</u>: Trusted leaders that work with all partners to facilitate Toronto's transit expansion initiatives.







Collectively, programs represent over \$50 billion in transit expansion investments












Infrastructure ONTARIO





Eglinton East Light Rail Transit

• 15km eastern extension of Line 5 - Eglinton Crosstown LRT (ECLRT) from Kennedy Station through the University of Toronto Scarborough (UTSC) to Malvern, with up to 21 stops and 3 connections to GO transit.

- Updates to reflect Provincial design changes to SSE, include:
 - A modified connection to Kennedy Station;

OVERVIEW

- Additional infrastructure, including a Maintenance and Storage Facility; and,
- Some technical work to revise the cost estimate of work on the Morningside Bridge over Highway 401 to reflect discussion with MTO about scope of bridge rehabilitation.
- Provides rapid transit service to underserved communities by travelling through or adjacent to seven Neighbourhood Improvement Areas
