Topic: Embodied Carbon Management Toolkit – Training Workshop for Ontario Municipalities

Date & Time: Oct 25 2024, 10:30 AM – 12 Noon

The City of Toronto has been collaborating with consultants Mantle Developments and Ha/f Climate Design through a TAFfunded study to develop an embodied carbon toolkit for municipal governments and construction projects. The toolkit presents recommendations to manage embodied carbon over three key topics:

- 1. Construction circularity
- 2. Urban design

Superior Court of Justice dismisses Ministry of Labour 's Appeal Regarding the City of Sudbury's Due Diligence Defense on Construction Project Fatality

The Ministry of Labour's charges against the City of Greater Sudbury regarding a fatality on their Elgin Street Construction Project in 2016 was referred by the Supreme Court of Canada back to the Superior Court of Justice for appeal by the Crown on the issue of the City's due diligence defense. A finding of due diligence by the City at the time in question would bring the matter to an end.

The Crown/Ministry of Labour's (MoL) appeal to the Superior Court of Justice that the City of Sudbury did not exercise due diligence, was dismissed on August 23, 2024.



MCEA REFORM


The MECP advised MEA earlier in 2024 that it intends to revoke the current Municipal Class EA and replace it with a new regulation (Municipal Project Assessment Process – MPAP). To date, MECP has not provided any timeline on when this will occur.

MCEA USER GUIDE

While the MECP is planning to revoke the MCEA, until the new MPAP Regulation is approved, the current MCEA process still applies. The MEA continues to offer its *MCEA User Guide (September 2023)* publication for proponents. It is currently available for purchase in hard copy format only.
